

The Swedish company Telaire Europe AB cooperates with Yamatake

After a long period of evaluating, a three-year-agreement has been made between the development and production company Telaire Europe AB in Delsbo, Sweden and the regulator company Yamatake in Asia. The agreement concerns the delivery of CO₂ sensors which partly are adapted to control ventilation in buildings to save energy and partly to control ventilation in garages to protect from too high percentage of toxic gases.

This year Telaire Europe also got an order worth 9 million Swedish crowns from the Swedish company Calectro AB. Telaire's CO₂ sensors is a part of the alarmsystems that Calectro exports to the German gastronomy market.

The history of Telaire Europe AB started at the University of Stockholm 1987. The research was concentrated upon gasmeasureings. Since 1990 the focus has been on the development of a CO₂ sensor for demand controlled ventilation. 1992 the development of the first digital CO₂ sensor started which one today is used of most of the world's great regulator companies. Telaire's latest generation of digital infrared gassensors combines even more functions than before - to an even lower price.
